

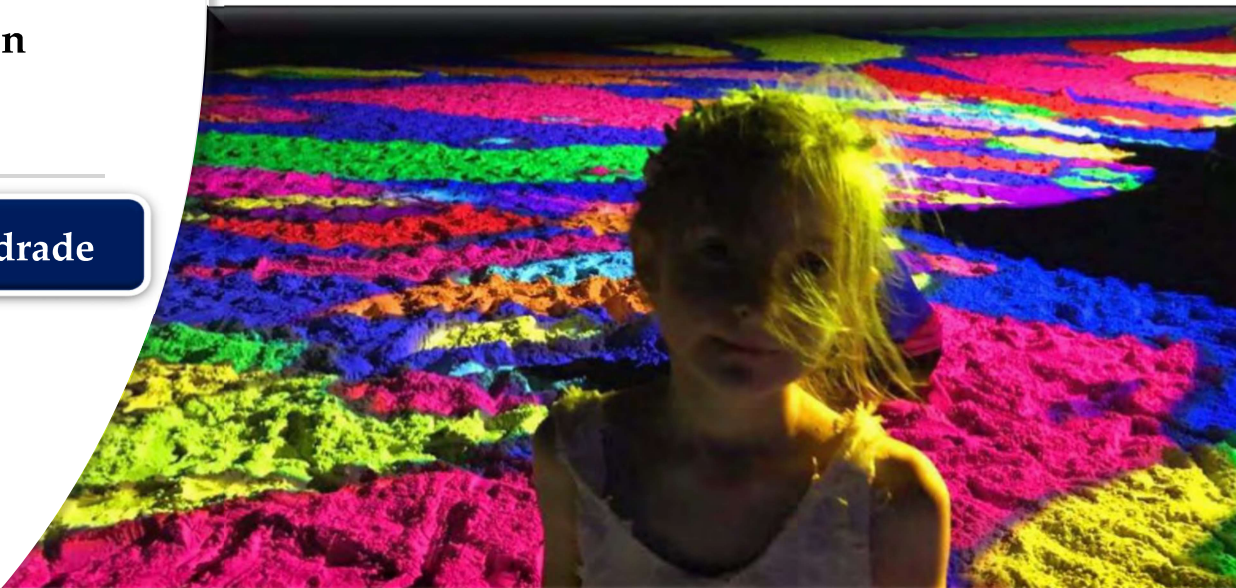

R.O. Schabbach: Credentials & Accomplishments

Renowned artist R.O. Schabbach was a pioneer in monumental light art installations and sculptures since 1981. As the **founder of Avant-garde artist groups**, he was known for his influential style, referred to by fine art critics as "Schabbachism." His work is found in esteemed collections including the Vatican, Guggenheim, and the private collections of celebrities like Madonna, Anthony Quinn and Bono.

Schabbach holds six world records, has won Biennale and Cultural Awards, and has been featured in global media. Mentored by art figures like Joseph Beuys, his art inspires philosophical discussions. His art is not only valued in the art market but also recognized for its therapeutic impact, promoting dopamine and serotonin release in the brain.

R.O. Schabbach's projects contribute to economic value by boosting tourism and local industries. His work **combines philosophical themes, colors, and forms to support mental and emotional well-being** while also benefiting local communities and industries globally.



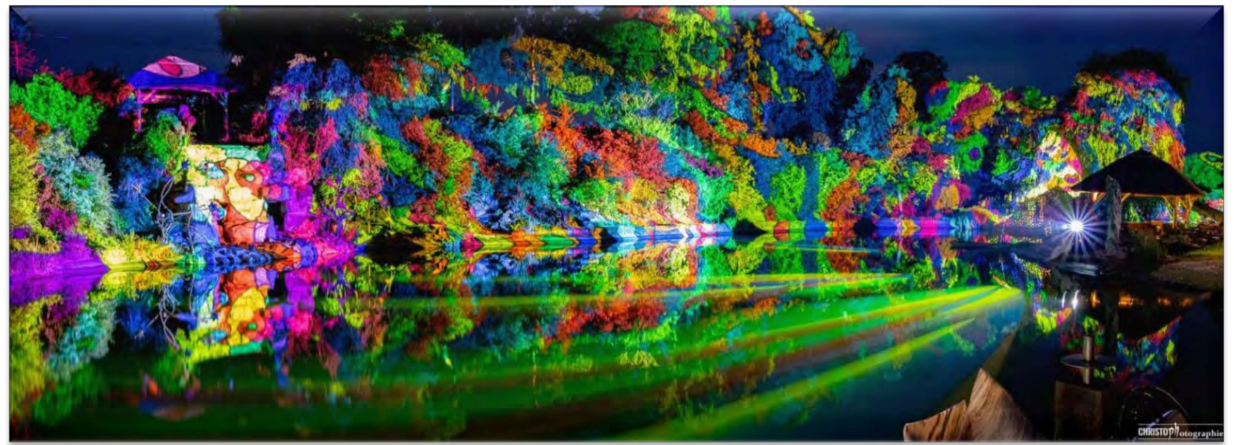


His legacy lives on through his wife, Sherri, who continues to honor and advance his groundbreaking contributions in the field of fine art.

Estimated Budget for Light Art Installation: **Approximately \$500,000**, covering:



Lighting Technology

100 “Roformers” (400 watts each, equipped with high-performance lenses).
100 “Robos” featuring exclusive R.O. Schabbach artwork.



Infrastructure & Logistics

Outdoor staging, scaffolding, and specialized cabling.
Certified electricians for setup and dismantling (14-day process).
Transport, travel, and labor costs.



Additional Costs

Intellectual property fees for custom-made art concepts and installations by Sherri Schabbach, owner of the rights to R.O. Schabbach's artwork, are determined on a case-by-case basis according to the individual dimensions and character of each project.
