TITLE: DISCUSS REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS FOR LICENSED PROPERTY MANAGERS

RECOMMENDATION

The Administration recommends implementing a registration process for licensed property managers to obtain a Business Tax Receipt, to include a registration fee and completion of a required two (2) hour training course.

BACKGROUND/HISTORY

At the October 30, 2024 Commission Meeting at the request of Commissioner Kristen Rosen Gonzalez, the Mayor and City Commission approved a referral to the Finance and Economic Resiliency Committee meeting to discuss the implementation of registration requirements for licensed property managers.

ANALYSIS

Currently, the City of Miami Beach does not have a registration process for licensed property managers. The City has a current Business Tax Receipt registration procedure for businesses; a similar process could be used for the requirements of licensed property managers.
