TITLE: AN ORDINANCE OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF MIAMI BEACH, FLORIDA, AMENDING CHAPTER 2, ENTITLED "ADMINISTRATION," ARTICLE II, ENTITLED "CITY COMMISSION," AT SECTION 2-16, ENTITLED "COMMISSION COMMITTEE DRAFT MINUTES-CITY COMMISSION APPROVAL," TO CLARIFY THAT CITY COMMISSION COMMITTEES MAY REQUEST INFORMATION OR ADMINISTRATIVE SUPPORT FROM THE CITY ADMINISTRATION, WITHIN THE SCOPE OF THE COMMITTEE REFERRAL, SUBJECT TO THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ORDINANCE; AND PROVIDING FOR REPEALER, SEVERABILITY, CODIFICATION, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BACKGROUND/HISTORY

ANALYSIS

At the request of Commissioner Kristen Rosen Gonzalez, the attached Ordinance has been placed on the September 11, 2024 City Commission meeting for First Reading.

Pursuant to Resolution No. 94-21382 (as amended and re-stated by Resolution No. 2024-32990), the City Commission has created three Commission Committees: the Land Use and Sustainability Committee, the Finance and Economic Resiliency Committee, and the Public Safety and Neighborhood Quality of Life Committee. The purpose of the Commission Committees is to carefully study policy issues, examine facts, and advise the Mayor and City Commission of their findings and recommendations. The Commission Committees are staffed by the City Administration, and legal counsel is provided by the City Attorney's Office.

The role of the Commission Committees is advisory, and any final or binding action of the City Commission (including, without limitation, adoption of legislation, approval of a contract, or appointment of a Charter officer) may only be taken by the City Commission, as the City's governing body, at a regular or special meeting. However, the Commission Committees are allocated sufficient resources to perform their work and develop their recommendations.

The attached Ordinance amends Chapter 2 of the City Code, "Administration," at Article II, "City Commission," to clarify that Commission Committees may, on a majority vote, request that the City Administration provide information or perform studies, investigations, or analysis, as long as the request is within the scope of the Committee referral; the request can be performed with existing budgeted resources; and, if the request involves a purchase of services, the purchase is within the City Manager's purchasing authority.
