

Djokovic in Wimbledon semis after de Minaur withdraws

Novak Djokovic advanced to his record-tying 13th Wimbledon semifinal after Australia's Alex de Minaur withdrew due to a hip injury on Wednesday. Scheduled to face Djokovic in the quarterfinals, de Minaur admitted that he injured his hip in the closing stages of his 6-2, 6-4, 4-6, 6-3 win over Arthur Fils in the fourth round on Monday. After attempting to warm up for less than eight minutes early in the day, de Minaur notified Wimbledon officials and Djokovic's camp he would be unable to recover in time to challenge the second-seeded Djokovic.

"I'm devastated, but I had to pull out due to a hip injury, a little tear of the fiber cartilage that is at the end to the adductor," de Minaur said. "I felt a loud crack during the last three points of my match against Fils and got a scan yesterday and it confirms that this was the injury. [There is] a high risk of making it worse if I was to step on court."

With the walkover win, Djokovic is tied with Roger Federer for the most Wimbledon semifinal appearances by a man in tournament history. The 37-year-old Serbian will square off Friday against No. 25 seed Lorenzo Musetti. The Italian ousted No. 13 Taylor Fritz 3-6, 7-6 (5), 6-2, 3-6, 6-1 on Wednesday.

As for de Minaur, he said he was at peace with his decision despite the chance to defeat Djokovic for the second time this year.

"It's no secret that, at this stage of my career, this was the biggest match

of my career. So wanted to do anything I could to play," he said. "I got the results yesterday. I knew what the results were yesterday. I still wanted to wake up today hoping that I would feel some sort of miracle and not feel it while I'm walking."

"The problem with me going out and playing is that one stretch, one slide, one anything, can make an injury [recovery] go from three to six weeks to four months. It's too much to risk."

Meanwhile, Musetti reached the final four at a Grand Slam for the first time with his victory over Fritz in 3 hours and 27 minutes. The 22-year-old is just the fourth Italian man to reach the semifinals at the All England Club, joining Janik Sinner (2023), Matteo Berrettini (2021) and Nicola Pietrangeli (1960).

Musetti dominated the decisive fifth set, posting 11 winners and breaking

Fritz's serve twice while also winning all seven of his points at the net. "I don't think I've realized yet what I have done," Musetti said in his on-court interview. "I was talking with my team about how to play on the big stage... It was the first time I've had the opportunity to walk out on this amazing stadium and it's been an honor for me."

"At the start of the match Taylor was really leading the game, especially with his serve, and I couldn't return well. In the second set I had a big reaction after breaking at the start and that changed my mind, my attitude. That probably made the difference and hopefully on Friday I will have the same one."

Musetti finished the match with 35 winners and 39 unforced errors, compared to 41 and 55 for Fritz.

Mystics fend off furious Fever rally, big game by Caitlin Clark, 89-84

Ariel Atkins scored 26 points and the Washington Mystics survived for an 89-84 road victory over the Indiana Fever on Wednesday afternoon at Indiana's Stefanie Dolson and Stefanie Dolson.

Julie Vanloo added 13 points apiece, while Aaliyah Edwards and Shatori Walker-Kimbrough came off the bench for 12 and 10 points, respectively.

The Mystics (6-17) finished a four-game road stretch with a 2-2 mark, snapping a two-game skid. They also avenged two losses to Indiana.

Caitlin Clark, in her first game since becoming the first rookie in WNBA history with a triple-double, racked up 29 points, 13 assists and five rebounds. She made five 3-pointers and was good on four free throws in the last 65 seconds.

Kelsey Mitchell supplied 15 points for Indiana, but she was 0-for-8 on 3s.

The Fever (9-14) were mistake-prone with 23 turnovers, but they made a late 12-0 run to trim the deficit to 85-80. Later, it was 87-84 after a Vanloo free throw.

Atkins shot 10-for-17 from the field to boost Washington's shooting percentage, which was 44 percent. Vanloo connected on three 3-point shots.

The margin was 76-55 entering the fourth quarter. The Fever pulled within 77-68 on Clark's jumper with about six minutes to go. Jade Melton and Atkins each hit two free throws before the Fever scored again.

The Mystics stormed out to a 33-19 lead early in the second quarter.



Caitlin Clark scored 29 points on Wednesday.

They took advantage of nine Indiana turnovers, while Vanloo drained a pair of 3-point shots. Washington received immediate offensive contributions from reserves; four bench players produced points across the game's first 12 minutes.

Indiana's early ball-handling problems negated the teams not shooting for much of the first half. The Fever shot 53.4 percent for the game, including 53.6 percent before halftime.

The injury list has remained a factor for the Mystics, who were without Shakira Austin (thigh), Karlise Samuelson (hand) and Brittney Sykes (hip). Emily Engstler was back in action after missing Saturday's game with an illness. She finished with four points.

Chennedy Carter scored 18 points and rookies Angel Reese and Kamila Cardoso both notched double-doubles to boost host Chicago over Atlanta on Wednesday.

Chicago outscored Atlanta 24-15 in the fourth quarter on the way to its third victory in the past four games.

The Dream have lost eight of nine, a slide that includes an eight-point

home loss to Chicago on July 2.

Marina Mabrey converted a three-point play to break a tie and put the Sky ahead 68-65 with 4:17 remaining in the game. Chicago (9-12) never relinquished the lead after that but the Dream stuck around.

Allisha Gray's layup off a backdoor-cut feed from Maya Caldwell drew Atlanta (7-14) to within a point with 1:23 to go. Dana Evans missed a free throw after referees whistled Atlanta coach Tanisha Wright for a technical foul, but the Sky recovered as Carter and Reese scored baskets on the next two possessions to help Chicago pull away.

Reese snagged a game-high 13 rebounds to go with 11 points that left the crowd in suspense. Reese extended her WNBA record to 14 consecutive games with a double-double thanks to a pair of free throws with 6.4 seconds left. The run includes three double-doubles against the Dream, who were led by Gray's 20 points.

● **Liberty 71, Sun 68:** Breanna Stewart posted 18 points, 14 rebounds and a pair of huge blocks in crunch time as visiting New York regained sole possession of first place in the WNBA by beating Connecticut on Wednesday in Uncasville, Conn. Sabrina Ionescu had 21 points, five rebounds and five assists, including the game-sealing basket in the final seconds, while Courtney Vandersloot scored 11 for New York (18-4).

DeWanna Bonner finished with 22 points and nine rebounds to lead the Sun (17-5).
