RECOMMENDATION

BACKGROUND/HISTORY

With the impending closure of the Regal South Beach Cinema on Lincoln Road, the City's cultural arts institutions such as the Wolfsonian-FIU, are uniquely positioned to become a popular destination for both residents and visitors who desire to see movies without leaving the City.

The Wolfsonian-FIU submitted a Cinema Upgrade Proposal for an upgrade of its existing audiovisual equipment (including installation) in the Wolfsonian Auditorium in the approximate amount of \$83,513.86.

Additionally, the proposal includes an annual programming budget (inclusive of all programming and operations costs) in the amount of \$34,444 to support the development and presentation of twelve (12) Monthly Free Friday Night screenings and allow for six (6) screening dates for use by other partners, including festivals such as

- Miami Jewish Film Festival
- Iffinito Brazilian Film Festival
- OUTshine Film Festival
- Popcorn Frights
- Miami Short Film Festival
- Third Horizon Film Festival
- American Black Film Festival
- Miami International Science Fiction Film Festival

By offering a new venue for screenings, The Wolfsonian can support the festivals while increasing the number and diversity of film offerings to Miami Beach residents."

Proposed Wolfsonian Audio Visual Upgrade to Support Cinema Programming

Equipment & Systems

Florida International University Media Technology Services has prepared a comprehensive quote to upgrade the existing audiovisual system in the Wolfsonian Auditorium. This proposal includes installing an updated projector with higher resolution and increased lumens, ensuring brighter, sharper, and more vivid images. Integrating an enhanced projection screen will further improve the visual clarity and quality.

Compared to the current systems, the updated projector, screen, and audio equipment will improve our visitors' viewing experience. However, our technicians noted that an acoustic review and improvements would be necessary for an optimal cinematic experience. A separate proposal and engagement with a firm specializing in acoustic assessments and recommendations would be required. This proposal does not include a request for an acoustical assessment or improvement.

The one-time budget to upgrade the audiovisual equipment (including installation) is \$83,513.86.

Proposed Wolfsonian Cinema Programming

12 Monthly Free Friday Night screenings

6 screening dates reserved for use by festivals or other partners

Free Friday Night screenings

These would consist of two series, running on alternating months. Each series would allow audiences to see a film and appreciate it in richer contexts formed by viewings of our collections and conversations led by experts.

One series would focus on foreign-language films, presented in partnership with local consulates (we have already successfully piloted this concept with the German consulate in 2023 and will repeat that in 2024). Each film would be selected in collaboration with cultural officers at the consulates, focusing on films from the pre-1945 period and/or corresponding to important themes from The Wolfsonian's collection (allowing us to show more contemporary titles if that is preferable). Each screening will be preceded by a special showing of relevant rare items in The Wolfsonian's library collection, led by Library Curator Frank Luca. A brief, expert-led discussion would follow the screenings.

The other series would consist of films that complement our exhibition program. For example, in the coming year, we will feature exhibitions that deal with the representation of landscapes in fine and decorative art, the work of Irish stained-glass artist Harry Clarke in the context of Ireland's independence movement, and visions of the future represented in 20th-century world fairs. Each of these themes lend themselves to pairings with films. The same is true of future planned exhibitions for 2025 and 2026, which will address (1) the evolution of guitar design and technology in the early 20th century and (2) jewelry design. A series of films about jewelry heists would be attractive, for example. As with the other series, we would offer a staff-led tour before each screening and expert-led discussions afterward.

Proposed Options

Seating

Our museum currently offers aesthetically pleasing and functional seating for most viewing purposes. However, the existing seats are not padded and may not be ideal for prolonged programming.

We have included an optional line item in our budget to acquire a padded seating option to address this. While this enhancement is unnecessary to improve the cinematic experience, it can increase visitor comfort during extended viewing.

The one-time budget for purchasing 80 padded seats (including storage carts and delivery) is \$24,800.
