A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF MIAMI BEACH, FLORIDA, INITIATING THE PROCEDURE FOR HISTORIC DESIGNATION SET FORTH IN SECTION 2.13.9 OF THE MIAMI BEACH RESILIENCY CODE, AND REQUESTING THE DESIGNATION OF THE FILLMORE MIAMI BEACH AT JACKIE GLEASON THEATER, LOCATED AT 1700 WASHINGTON AVENUE, AS AN INDIVIDUAL HISTORIC SITE.

WHEREAS, The Fillmore Miami Beach at Jackie Gleason Theater (the "Fillmore Theater"), located at 1700 Washington Avenue in Miami Beach, was originally opened as the Miami Beach Auditorium in 1950, and has served as a prominent venue for entertainment and cultural events in the City of Miami Beach for over seven decades; and

WHEREAS, the Fillmore Theater holds a unique place in the cultural and architectural heritage of Miami Beach, having hosted countless performances, films, and live shows that have contributed to the city's identity as a vibrant cultural hub; and

WHEREAS, the building's original architectural style, including its distinctive design elements and historical significance as a venue for major performances, underscores its importance to the community's cultural history; and

WHEREAS, a request for designation as an individual historic site may be initiated by Resolution of the City Commission; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Commission recognize the Fillmore Theater as a significant historical and cultural landmark deserving of preservation.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF MIAMI BEACH, FLORIDA, that the Mayor and City Commission hereby initiate the procedure for historic designation set forth in Section 2.13.9 of the Miami Beach Resiliency Code for The Fillmore Miami Beach at Jackie Gleason Theater, located at 1700 Washington Avenue, as an individual historic site.
